Pathway to Prevention

A THREE STEP PROGRAM

Screen. Monitor. Prevent



screening for type 1 diabetes



Step one

Type1Screen offers free risk screening for type 1 diabetes to those aged 2 - 30 years who have a family member diagnosed with the condition. This could be a parent, sibling, aunt, uncle, grandparent, or cousin known to have type 1 diabetes.

Screening involves a blood test.
This can be arranged by visiting
www.type1screen.org, reading
and signing the consent form and
emailing it to

type1screen@mh.org.au. The team will send you a request form that you can take to your nearest pathology collection centre anywhere in Australia or NZ.



If the blood test reveals a negative result, that's it! However, Type1Screen can offer you another blood test in five years time if you wish.

Should the blood test result be positive for islet auto-antibodies, another blood test will be organised to confirm this result. Two consecutive positive results indicate a high risk for developing type 1 diabetes.

Those confirmed to be positive will be offered more regular monitoring and the option to participate in prevention and early intervention studies through TrialNet.



Step three

TrialNet offers innovative clinical studies which look at ways to maintain insulin production before and after clinical diagnosis of type 1 diabetes. These studies are trying to find ways to slow or stop the progression of the condition.
